

Work Nights/Set-Up/Weigh-In Details

Monday, August 1st – 5pm

- Work Night – general grounds clean-up
- Please bring wheelbarrows, shovels, rakes, painting supplies, etc. for a general grounds clean-up.

Monday, August 8th – 5pm

- MANDATORY work night. All exhibitors must attend
- Setting up pens/barns as needed, finishing any general fair tasks
- Pen assignments – will only be given once prep work is done
- NO TACK OR ANIMALS to be brought in tonight

Tuesday, August 9th

- Tack/Supply Drop Off between **8am – 3pm**
- NO ANIMALS on fairgrounds until specified check-in times!

Small Animals: Check-In information will be given directly from barn superintendent closer to fair.

- *No animals allowed on fairgrounds prior to check-in.*
- Enter through the North Livestock Gate

Goats: Check-In from **4 – 6 pm.**

- *No animals allowed on fairgrounds prior to check-in.* All animals will be inspected at the scale *before* entering the barn, including breeding stock
- MUST have a scrapie tag in animal ear when brought to weigh-in.
- MUST have your health certificate (and out of state paperwork, if applicable) filled out and present at this time.
- Vehicles/Trailers will enter through the North Livestock Gate, you will be directed into the livestock parking area and will walk your animal to the scale at the north end of Sheep Barn. Vehicles/Trailers will exit out the rodeo gate, following signs.

Beef: Check-in from **5 – 6:30pm**

- *No animals allowed on fairgrounds prior to check-in.* Animals will be inspected *before* entering the barn, including breeding stock.
- MUST have health certificates, brand papers, consignment slips to YVFR, and bill of sale ready to hand in as soon as animals are safely in the barn.
- Vehicles/Trailers will enter through the North Livestock Gate. You will be directed to drive behind the livestock office to the main scale. Vehicles will exit out the rodeo gate, following signs.
- Beef check-in is the same time as dairy check-in so all vehicles/trailers from both species will be in the same line.

Dairy: Check-In from **5 – 6:30pm**

- *No animals allowed on fairgrounds prior to check-in.* Animals will be inspected *before* entering barn.
- Vehicles/Trailers will enter through the North Livestock Gate. You will follow the road to the corner of the small animal barn where you will unload your animals and walk them to the barn for check-in.
- Vehicles/Trailers will exit out the rodeo gate, following signs.
- Dairy check-in is the same time as beef check-in so all vehicles/trailers from both species will be in the same line.

Sheep: Check-In from 6 – 9 pm.

- *No animals allowed on fairgrounds prior to check-in.* All animals will be inspected at the scale *before* entering the barn, including breeding stock
- MUST have a scrapie tag in animal ear when brought to weigh-in.
- MUST have your health certificate (and out of state paperwork, if applicable) filled out and present at this time.
- Vehicles/Trailers will enter through the North Livestock Gate, you will be directed into the livestock parking area and will walk your animal to the scale at the north end of Sheep Barn. Vehicles/Trailers will exit out the rodeo gate, following signs.

Swine: Check-In Tuesday, August 10th 6:30 – 9pm

- *No animals allowed on fairgrounds prior to check-in.* Animals will be inspected *before* entering the barn, including breeding stock.
- MUST have health certificates (and out of state paperwork, if applicable) filled out to hand in at the scale during weigh-in.
- Vehicles/Trailers will be staged in the general parking lot until beef/dairy check-in is completed, then directed from the general parking lot through the North Livestock Gate to the main scale for weigh-in.
- Vehicles/Trailers will then exit out the rodeo gate, following signs.
