Work Night

August 1st @ 5:30pm – Please bring gloves, wheelbarrows, shovels, rakes, brooms, hoses, painting supplies for a general grounds clean-up night.

Fair Week Reminders

Monday (August 8):

- RV Parking from 5-8pm
- **MANDATORY** work night for all exhibitors @ 5:30pm – come to sale ring for exhibitor meeting
- **NO** tack or animals on grounds today
- Please come prepared to set-up barns and complete remaining clean-up tasks
- Pen assignments may be given tonight once all jobs are completed

Tuesday (August 9):

- Pen assignments posted, if not done Monday
- Tack brought to fairgrounds from 8am-3pm, Educational displays must be up by Wednesday
- **ABSOLUTELY NO** animals on grounds prior to being checked-in/weighed.
 - See additional attachment for check-in/weigh-in instructions split by species
- When you arrive at weigh-in, be prepared with all health paperwork ready to hand in.
 - *All MARKET exhibitors* MUST also provide a 4x6" printed photo of the exhibitor with the animal. If you have two market animals, 2 pictures must be provided. These will be given to the buyer during the market stock sale.
- *EXHIBITORS WITH MULTIPLE SPECIES:* Dairy animals will need to be unloaded 1st. So, if your trailer is coming with dairy and beef or sheep/goats, please have dairy in the trailer compartment able to unload first.

FAQs

Are record books required? While not required this year, we encourage all exhibitors to bring their record book to be entered in a record book contest. Awards will be given based on age division.

What about educational displays? Each exhibitor will be required to have an educational poster/display above their pen for EACH species they are showing. 4-H clubs, FFA chapters, and other exhibitor groups will need to identify their pens with club displays. Stall cards (provided by the fair) are required to be visible at all times.

How is the showing split up this year? Market classification will all be shown together, based on animal check-in weight, regardless if registered as 4-H, FFA, or Open. One Grand Champion and One Reserve Champion will be selected for market in each species. Fitting and Showing will be shown based on exhibitor age, as selected during registration, regardless of 4-H, FFA, Open status.

Who will show in Round Robin? The Grand Champion and Reserve Champion showman from the 14-19 age division in Beef, Dairy, Goat, Sheep, and Swine will all participate in the Round Robin.

Can I still enter still life exhibits? YES! Plan to bring still life entries! These can be open class exhibits, so guardians you can participate too. Entries can include crafts, gardening, baked goods, photography. Save time by entering ahead of time using FairEntry, just like the animal entries.
